Intersection Road Safety Award

Application guide

Object	This awards recognizes excellence in community policing for a project who's main objective is putting the guiding principles into practice, in the context of road safety.
Description	<p>The proposed project must address one of the components of community policing. You can therefore apply for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• A proximity project with the citizens;• A partnership project;• A problem-solving project;• A prevention project.
Eligibility	The application must be submitted on behalf of a police department and receive the support of its management.

Transmission of the application file

- The deadline is June 19, 2020;
- The application must be sent only by email to the address listed at the bottom of this page;
- The name of the digital file sent must explicitly refer to the name of the project being nominated. As: *Bid Intersection Road safety Award 2020 - project name*;
- The number of pages should be five to ten (Clear-concise-accurate);
- Minimum character size must be equal to or greater than 11 points;
- The transmitted documents will figure in the library of the Intersection Network's Web site and could be used for subsequent publication by the Intersection Network and / or by the Ministry of Public Security.
- Instructions for annexes if required:
 - a) They must be digitized ¹.
 - b) If possible, we would appreciate receiving any support tool that you already have from your project.
- Projects that cannot be submitted:
 - a) Projects that have been completed for more than 2 years;
 - b) Projects of former finalists;
 - c) Projects that have already won an Intersection Award-
- The first page of the application file must be the one that the Intersection Network provides on the next page (it is not calculated in the number of pages of the application).
- Please indicate if this project was inspired by a previous project, what organization it comes from and how it stands out differently?
