

Intersection Award of Excellence Guide 2023

Foreword

The INTERSECTION Network mission is to develop, implement and promote a police model that builds on the components of the community policing approach by mobilizing stakeholders to prevent crime and make the community safe and secure. The Intersection Excellence Award recognizes a project that has contributed to the development of community policing for police organizations that are part of the Intersection Network. One way to promote this approach is to highlight the excellence of the initiatives, projects or programs put forward by police services. Since 1996, the Intersection Network has been awarding annual prizes. You can submit a project based on one of the four components of the community policing approach, as formulated within the departmental policy, towards a more Community-Based Policing¹. A prize is awarded to the best project, all approaches combined. You will find all the necessary information to submit your application within the following pages.

Also, make sure you are registered for the Intersection / MSP Seminar to receive your prize in the event that you should win!

Intersection Award of Excellence Guide 2023

Object	The purpose of this award is to recognize excellence in community policing for a project that puts the guiding principles into practice.		
Description	The proposed project must address one of the components of community policing. You can therefore apply for:		
	 A proximity project with the citizens; A partnership project; A problem-solving project; A Prevention Project. 		
Eligibility	In compliance with the internal validation procedures specific to the police organization concerned, the application must ultimately be submitted on behalf of the police service and receive the support of its management.		

Transmission of the application file

- It is in the interest of fair support that the Awards Committee is offering a video presentation accessible via the Intersection Network website in the multimedia section. The objective of this presentation will specify the elements required for the final submission of the application on June 30, 2023, midnight;
- The application must be sent **only by email** to the address listed at the bottom of this page;
- The name of the digital file sent must explicitly refer to the name of the nominated project. Such as: Intersection MSP 2023 Award Nomination project name;
- The first page of the application must be the one provided by Intersection Network on the following page (this page is not calculated in the number of pages of the application) (any visual support: video links, posters, flyers, press articles, etc. must be provided as an appendix)
- The number of pages must be a maximum of one double-sided page. It is a summary of the project that describes the criteria on the following pages: identification of the need, project planning, implementation, monitoring and evaluation, originality and transferability and other components. Everything must be clear, concise and precise since you will be asked to present your project virtually using a PowerPoint, as specified below;
- Minimum character size must be equal to or greater than 11 points;
- The documents submitted will be posted on the Intersection Network website and may be used for further publication by the Intersection Network and/or the Ministry of Public Safety;
- Projects that cannot be submitted:
 - a) Projects that have been completed more than 2 years prior to the call for nominations;
 - c) Projects that have already won an Intersection Award.
- No form of plagiarism will be accepted. Please indicate whether this project builds on a previous project, from which organization it comes and how it differs from previous projects.
- Applicants will be notified by email after the final application deadline in June to schedule a
 virtual presentation using a PowerPoint in which all evaluation criteria must be presented. This
 presentation will take place in September 2023;
- The presentation will be a maximum of 15 minutes (including any visual support: videos, posters, pamphlets, press articles, etc.) and 10 minutes will be reserved to the awards committee for a question period if necessary;

How to present the 2023 application

The summary of the application must be submitted by midnight, June 30, 2023.

The number of pages must be one page double-sided, it is a summary of the project that describes the criteria on the following pages 5 to 8: identification of the need, project planning, implementation, monitoring and evaluation, originality and transferability and other components. In september 2023, your project will be presented virtually by the Teams platform to all members of the Awards Committee.

Your presentation must be supported by a PowerPoint and will be a maximum of 15 minutes (including all visual supports: videos, posters, flyers, press articles, etc.). In addition, 10 minutes will be allotted to the Awards Committee for a question period if necessary.

Your presentation will be evaluated according to the evaluation criteria listed on the following pages. (Please refer to pages 5 to 8).

The invitation date for this presentation will be communicated individually to each nominator between the months of July and August.
